



Artist Biography - June 2011

Georgia Germein is an Australian, Adelaide based acoustic pop singer-songwriter who is already achieving an extensive amount for someone so young in their musical career.

Her unique style blends the exuberance of pop with an acoustic earthy texture, topping it off with the ringing purity and precision of her vocal delivery. Drawing on her experiences of growing up in the bush in the Adelaide Hills, her love of the ocean and travelling, combined with her commitment to the Environment, Indigenous Reconciliation, her work in the Kalahari, South Africa and Nepal as World Vision's 2010 Youth Ambassador, Georgia is a promise of extraordinary things coming your way.

Georgia's debut album "Take My Hand" released late 2010 and produced with Ian Pritchett (Angus & Julia Stone and the Beautiful Girls) is enjoying airplay on community radio across the nation. Her songs are being played in stores across Australia including David Jones, Peter Alexander, Colorado and IKEA, as well as ABC's Digital Music playlist and the Sounds Like Café compilation that is played in over 1200 cafes around Australia. Already requiring a second printing for this album due to a sellout, Georgia is excited to have her album distributed through MGM nationally and internationally.

Winning a number of prestigious awards including seven ASME Young Composers Awards, the 2007 South Australian Premiers Award, National winner of the 2009 Young Bloods Radio Competition for Nova, semi finalist status in the 2007 International Songwriting Competition, and a semi-finalist in the Channel 9 Young Achievers Awards; it is clear that Georgia has already achieved a great deal.

Performing either solo (vocals, guitars/piano), or having her songs brought to new heights with her beautiful sisters Ella Germein (bass/synth, backing vocals) and Clara Germein (drums, backing vocals), the list of live appearances for the three girls in 2010/2011 is extensive. These include sold out shows at the Adelaide Fringe Festival, performances at the Channel 9 Young Achievers Gala Presentation Dinner, Skillogalee Winery for the Clare Valley Gourmet Festival, Fuse Ignition Showcase, Sea and Vines Festival, Fleurieu Folk Festival, Natuzzi Food, Wine and Music Festival, World Vision Global Leadership Conventions in Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide, guest artist at UniSA O Week and Open Day, UNIFEM, Guest speaker/artist at the launch of the Globalist Magazine and many more.

Georgia and her sisters have supported Australian music legends Renee Geyer, Brian Cadd, Russel Morris, Ross Wilson, Joe Camilleri and the Black Sorrows.

A highly successful tour of Malaysia in 2010 encouraged Georgia and her sisters to get on the road, touring extensively through regional South Australia and southern Victoria in 2011.

Georgia, as World Vision's Youth Ambassador travelled around the State speaking and performing at more than 70 schools reaching over 40,000 students in 2010. She is pleased to continue her relationship with World Vision, being recently selected as a World Vision Artist Associate, alongside inspiring talents including Brooke Fraser.

Her passion for the environment is also evident, being a youth advocate for the Nature Foundation South Australia, a member of Fauna Rescue, and also a carer of orphaned kangaroo joeys. Part of a beach loving family, Georgia and her sisters are also very keen surfers.

Georgia is thrilled to announce the release of her two new music videos, which are now available for viewing on Youtube. Filmed in Adelaide and the beautiful Adelaide Hills by Taste Media they feature Georgia, her sisters, Ms B Elsegood, family and friends.
